Masonic History

This year our December communication occurred on December 7th so it is only fitting that this month's Masonic History is about the Masonic connection to the Pearl Harbor Investigation which occurred in 1944. On December 7th, 1941 the Japanese undertook an ambitious attack on the naval base at Pearl Harbor. This horrible attack dealt a major blow to Pacific Fleet Operations and claimed many lives but ultimately served to push the United States into full military action against the Japanese and other Axis powers. Following the attack there were many conspiracy theories about the attack and whether President Roosevelt or anyone else was aware of it before it occurred. Due to this Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson ordered an investigation into the attack in 1944. He asked Major Henry C. Clausen to conduct the investigation which would last until 1945. Henry C. Clausen was a prominent Freemason and would go on to be the Sovereign Grand Commander of the Supreme Council, Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction.

In his *Lexicon of Freemasonry* Albert Mackey tells us that the beehive is “an emblem of industry appropriated to the third degree. This is a virtue ever held in high esteem among the craft, for our old charges tell us that all Masons shall work honestly on working days, that they may live creditably on holidays.” And our own *Ahiman Rezon* explains it as “an emblem of industry, and recommends the practice of that virtue to all created beings, from the highest seraph in heaven to the lowest reptile of the dust. 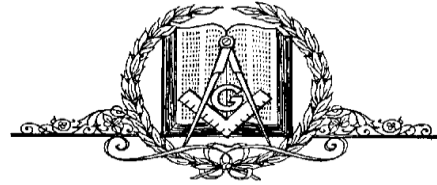
